# Poldy's Number Game

2-4 Players

Place all the cards face downwards with the spots uppermost.

The youngest starts by throwing the die. If he/she throws a 6 he may start, if a six is not thrown the die is passed to the next player.

Once a 6 is thrown that player picks up a card with 6 spots on the back and places it face upwards in front of him (Poldy's body), play then passes to the next player. Once you have thrown a 6 you can throw in any order to make up the rest of Poldy's body.

If at any time a player throws a number he already has, play moves on to the next person.

The winner is the first player to complete Poldy.

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What was it like if you kept throwing a number you had already rolled?

What would it be like if we were all good at the same things and no one could do certain jobs that were needed?
